My experience with the Bilingual Project

I was given the opportunity to learn English at school since I was 3 years old. My distant memories of when I was little include singing songs in English, reading books in English, describing pictures, as well as many others. I believe all of them have contributed in a positive way to my current English level. Being surrounded by English since I was a child has made me much more comfortable and more used to the language and has improved my pronunciation and my understanding when native people talk in English.
