

How to make Easter Eggs

You will need:

- Eggs in their egg box
- A **pin** or a **needle**
- A **toothpick**
- A bowl
- Coloured pens, paint, or other decorations.
- A straw (if you have one)



1. Sit an egg in your egg box so it doesn't move. Carefully make a **hole** in the top of the egg with your pin or needle. Once you have made a small hole, move the pin or needle around to make the hole wider.
2. Take the toothpick and insert it into the hole; move it around inside the egg to break up the **yolk**.
3. Flip the egg over and make a second hole on the bottom of the egg with your pin or needle. Try to make the hole on the bottom of the egg a little bigger but don't **crack** the shell! Use the toothpick again to break up the yolk more.
4. Hold the egg over the bowl with the bigger hole facing down. Use a straw to **blow** out the contents of the egg by placing the tip of the straw at the hole and blowing hard. If you don't have a straw, you can put your mouth directly on the egg - but be careful to only blow out, and not to breathe in! First the white part will come out, then the yolk. It can take a while to get moving, so be **patient**.
5. Clean the shell by holding it carefully under hot water from the **kitchen tap**. Then leave the egg to dry.
6. Now you're ready to decorate with paint, pens, stickers, glitter or however you like!

Pin	An empty place or missing part of a surface.
Needle	The yellow part of an egg.
Toothpick	A small sharp metal point used for sewing.
Hole	To break or split something.
Yolk	The metal tube where water flows into the sink.
Crack	Being calm if something takes a long time.
Blow	A thin piece of metal to attach fabrics together
Patient	To expel air through your lips.
Kitchen tap	A small stick made of wood used to pick up food or clean your teeth
